Ready for Work, run by Stirling Council is an alternative curriculum for S4 young people centred on employability skills, literacy, numeracy and work experience. It provides a different context for learning to prepare young people for the workplace. Their work with young people is underpinned by the relationships they develop with local businesses within the community. Businesses are able to provide opportunities for young people to enter the workplace and gain valuable experience, but partnering with education in this way also has its benefits for local industry as it allows businesses direct access to tap in to the local talented young workforce.

Kieran was referred to the Ready for Work programme by his secondary school as he was ready for a change of learning environment. As he had a flair for cooking and IT he had some great options but his real passion was in working with cars.
